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There are two areas where Community-based Aid *may* overlap with DMC:

1. Specific programs designed to address over represented groups;
2. Community Planning should be conducted around relevant data points. Especially for counties that fund system improvement.

- LC- Latina Leaders and Joven Noble
 - LC- Strong & Smart Girls and Talented Tenth
 - LC- Mother Daughter Circles
 - DC - Refugee Juvenile Justice Advocate
 - DC - Community Implementation of Preventative Service / Delivery for Minority Youth and Families (1 Thrive Center and 2 in Latino Center)
 - PC- Triumph Builders Club and Upward Movement
 - BBC – Diversion with Cultural Elements

Funding individual programs
is not the same as addressing
systemic disproportionate
contact.

- Cultural programs at best target a specific point in the system, and/ or a specific group.
- While this is worthwhile and important, it does not address the systematic issues that drive DMC.

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Youth Services working on new comp plan

WAHOO – Saunders County Youth Services is holding a county-wide meeting Oct. 17 to discuss the county’s comprehensive juvenile services plan.

The comprehensive plan addresses the strengths, needs, services and programs for juveniles in the county, said Youth Services Program Director Amber Pelan.

The plan is required by the Nebraska Crime Commission and by state statute if the county is to receive grant funding for juvenile programs and services, she added.

Reassessment of the comprehensive plan is done every three years and changes to the plan are based off data collected during that time.

Current youth services programs covered under the crime commission grant include court appointed special advocates, truancy officers, school-based behavioral health programming, electronic monitoring, tracking services and others.
