As part of the evaluation, young people will participate in small in-person focus groups held by Child Trends to share their experiences and thoughts on b2i and related programming/services. We need your help recruiting interested young people to participate.

**Here are the focus group details:**

- Focus groups will be held in Omaha and Columbus in April (and scheduled according to participant availability)
- Focus groups will last approximately 1.5 hours each
- Young people will receive a \$50 Amazon gift card, a free meal, and be entered into an additional raffle for participating.
- Childcare options will be available, and young people will be reimbursed for travel. Possible transportation assistance may also be explored/provided.
- We are looking for young people age 19 or older, who were in foster care in 2010 or later, and were in foster care after their 16th birthday. If you're unsure a young person fits the criteria, that's ok. We will verify their eligibility.
- The information young people share will be protected. They will be asked to consent to participate in the focus group, and all focus group materials are approved by Child Trends' International Review Board (IRB).
