
AR Committee Statute Cont.

- 3. The ongoing use of traditional response
- 4. The provision of services within AR and non-court involved cases to ensure child safety, reduce the risk of child abuse/neglect and to engage famililes.

NCC & Committee Structure

- ✓ NCC members are appointed by the governor for 2 year terms
- ✓ NCC members vote to confirm membership for statutory committees
- ✓ NCC can assign tasks to statutory committees
- ✓ Formal recommendation from statutory committees are approved by NCC prior to being advanced to legislators and DHHS.
- ✓ One of the co-chairs of each statutory committee must be an NCC member
- ✓ NCC members who are committee co-chairs provide regular updates at NCC meetings
