


Initial Assessment (TR)- Safety Assessment



If children are SAFE follow Prevention/Risk Assessment score guidance


Initial Assessment (TR)-Prevention/Risk Assessment



Approved Informal Living Arrangements

Child is considered CONDITIONALLY SAFE and their parents/caregiver has made arrangements for a temporary and alternative place for the child to reside until child safety can be managed in the home.

Parents are asked to identify individual(s), including non-custodial parent, relatives, and others known to the child(ren) who the parent could contact to make temporary living arrangements.

CFSS completes
background checks
and assesses for
suitability of the
potential temporary
alternative caregivers
to access for safety
concerns.

CFSS will assess the parent's level of agreement to cooperate with the plan for the child(ren) to temporarily reside out of the home.

CFSS will advise the parent that DCFS does not consider this foster care, and therefore, parent is still legally and financially responsible for child(ren).

CFSS will advise the temporary alternative caretaker that DCFS does not consider this foster care. If a relative, inform them of their ability to apply for TANF relative payment.

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AILA Continued

Encourage the parent to provide a consent for the temporary alternative caretaker to obtain medical care and assist with meeting education needs of the child(ren).

Document Safety
Assessment as
"Conditionally Safe",
and complete the
Safety Plan.

Document
Prevention/Risk
Assessment and
"Approved Informal
Living Arrangement"
on NFOCUS.

Develop guidelines within the Safety Plan for parent and child contact.

After completing the AILA- Review the family's progress according to the time frames of the case plan

The Parents have the right to terminate the AILA at any time, and the child must be returned home.

If the child does not return home within six months and the presenting situation still exists, a referral may be made to the County Attorney for possible filing.
