5. Legislative Update

Laura Opfer shared the JSC/NCJJ Legislative Bill Update handout and discussed past and upcoming legislation. Judge Jay discussed a committee that will be looking at reviewing the juvenile code for clarity.

6. JSC/NCJJ Annual Report (Action Item)

Co-Chairs

a. Laura Opfer shared highlights from the <u>JSC/NCJJ Joint Annual Report</u> handout. NCJJ Chair Menzel noted that the groups should consider changing RED to R/ED due to a shift in language usage. Laura noted that this change would be made throughout the report.

R/ED Co-chair Tami Soper shared information regarding the recommendations of the R/ED Committee. Members also discussed the shift of language usage from 'juvenile' to "youth" to reduce stigma.

Opfer continued by sharing recommendations from the YRTC Workgroup. Mark LaBouchardiere shared information regarding the recommendations. Members discussed the status of the workgroup's look into accreditation.

Members discussed YRTC intake guidance education for stakeholders. Laura Opfer shared potential recommendation language. Members discussed at length. JSC Co-Chair Deb VanDyke-Ries noted that discussion has led to the need to table specific recommendations regarding intake education, and rather note that the workgroup will continue to discuss the recommendations.

Laura Opfer shared recommendations from the Access to Services Workgroup. Workgroup Chair, Julie Smith shared additional information.

Members discussed additional changes.

7. Membership Vacancies

Children's Commission Staff, Adam Anderson shared vacancies on the JSC. He noted that JSC is currently looking for a judge representative who would fill a voting membership.

8. JSC Workgroup Updates

a. Needs Assessment

Access to Services Workgroup Chair, Julie Smith shared that the group rebranding the Needs Assessment Workgroup to the Access to Services Workgroup and looking for members if interested. She noted that the workgroup has met once to discuss the direction for the group.

b. Racial & Ethnic Disparities

R/ED Workgroup member, Tami Soper shared information regarding the work that has occurred over the past year. Laura Opfer shared additional background information that helped informed the work of the workgroup.

c. Youth Rehabilitation and Treatment Centers

Mark LaBouchardiere shared information regarding the work of the workgroup and recent workgroup discussions. Members discussed that youth at YRTCs are considered "escaped" when they are missing from care while committed to the YRTCs.

9. Center for Coordinated Assistance to the States

NCJJ Chair Menzel discussed CCAS. She noted that CCAS is providing technical assistance continuing the work done by the Juvenile Justice Institute for developing the state plan for returning for to Title II Compliance.

10. NCII Subcommittee Updates

a. Executive Subcommittee

NCJJ Chair Menzel shared information regarding the work of the Subcommittee, including discussing resource books, youth outreach, educational outreach.

b. Community Planning Advisory Subcommittee

Erin Wasserberger noted that recent meeting have discussed taking the Community Planning process back to the basics listed in statute and providing more one-on-one assistance to the counties. She noted this process is in the works and further discussion will need to be had to determine its feasibility.

c. Juvenile Diversion Subcommittee

Vice Chair Denise Kracl noted the group is still working on the NSAT, to bring more uniformity across the state. She noted Dr. Hamilton completed the assessment in 2021 and now Colfax is piloting the tool and looking to utilize the testing to bring more uniformity across the state.

d. Grant Review Subcommittee

Kari Rumbaugh noted that grant work has settled down. Juvenile Services grants have been posted and received by the counties. Other grant writing is in the process. Erin Wasserberger noted that a supplement enhancement grant is pending, closing August 5.

e. Young Adult Subcommittee

Chair Menzel noted that Stanford Bradley and Bobbi Taylor attended the NJJA Conference and CJJ Conference.

11. Probation Update

Kari Rumbaugh shared information regarding Probation. She shared information regarding recent commendations awarded to Probation employees. She shared a <u>Detailed Analysis Fiscal Year 2021</u> handout and discussed.

Rumbaugh addressed the question of adding additional foster parents. She noted that Probation has added Professional Foster Care as well as continued outreach for more homes. She also shared information regarding Emergency Foster Care. Kelli Schadwinkel discussed additional efforts to support Relative and Kinship homes.

Rumbaugh noted that in future years Probation will begin to use fundamental data measures determined by the National Center for Juvenile Justice believed to be best practice. She shared that there may be a change in future reports, but some work is already being done.

12. YRTC Update

Mark LaBoucharediere shared that Lincoln and Hastings did well on the ACA review. He also shared that Dr. Fromm has left and been replaced by Dr. Wittry. Paul Gordon shared information regarding the programming and activities of the YRTCs. He shared activities such as Pony Express and community service have been successful, such as theatre and animal shelter community service. Gordon shared that engagement continues to be successful. Gordon shared that recent engagement topics have included money management, and questions and answers from employees. Gordon noted that vocational opportunities are being discussed, as well as a relationship with CCC. The YRTCs are also looking for employment opportunities in the community for youth, Gordon shared. LaBouchardiere and Gordon shared information regarding a special event planned for the youth. Kelli Schadwinkel commended YRTC Kearney for the recent collaboration with Probation and work done.

13. Public Comment

The floor was opened to public comment. There was no public comment.

14. New Business

Tammy Sassaman thanked members for the NJJA conference. She noted there were 334 participants this year, and she encouraged agencies to apply for grants for youth and families attend the conference next year.
