






## Commission Activities

Activities of the Commission have ranged over the years from large scale to small scale and at various locations in the state


- Annual Reports to the HHS Committee of the Legislature and Governor

- Approval Process
- Annual Reports
  - Due September 1<sup>st</sup> annually
    - Includes Commission, Bridge to Independence Advisory Committee, Juvenile Services Committee, and Strengthening Families Act Committee
    - FCRRC is due every 4 years, next report will be in 2024

Nebraska Open Meetings Act



#### Examples of reasons to take a vote:

- Official business (approving the minutes, appointing members to statutory committees, approving the agenda)
- Taking a position (proposed regulations, legislative hearings, issuing a stance in a public forum)
- Approving any final report of the Commission or a statutory committee
- Approving the recommendations by statutory committees



### How to Vote!

- A voting member makes a **MOTION**.
- A voting member **SECONDS THE MOTION**.
- DISCUSSION ensues.
- Members VOTE.

FOR AGAINST ABSTAIN

Example: The vote will carry if the majority of the votes are FOR, even if the majority of the votes are ABSTAIN.


