5. Policy Analyst

Adam Anderson shared an update on the Policy Analyst position following Chloe Fowler's departure. Zac Ross has accepted the Child Welfare Policy Analyst position, starting the following Monday. Zac brings eight years of experience with DHHS and DAS. In the interim, Anderson has been filling in to complete the pending annual report drafts

6. Annual Report

Adam Anderson presented the draft Annual Report, highlighting updates made to transition from past joint reporting with the Coalition for Juvenile Justice to individual organizational reports while maintaining collaborative efforts.

- **Discussion & Edits:** Judge Denise Kracl requested technical corrections to statutory citations on page 2 (standardizing to Neb. Rev. Stat. § 71-807) and requested her title be corrected to *County Court Judge, Fifth Judicial District*. It was also noted to ensure Amoreena Brady is listed under the membership roster.

7. JSC Workgroup Updates

a. Access to Services

Dr. Matt Wittry shared an update regarding the workgroup's progress. The group is compiling information into an interim study-style presentation focusing on high-utilization youth with complex needs across juvenile justice, CFS, education, and Medicaid. The effort seeks to pair total cost data with outcomes to support the need for expanded service definitions and access to high-intensity services. Nick Juliano and Dr. Wittry discussed historical PRTF compliance models and aligning future blended funding proposals.

b. Racial & Ethnic Disparities

Adam Anderson and Tami Soper provided an update for the workgroup. The workgroup has not met recently. Discussions were held regarding aligning workgroup goals with the Children's Commission's strategic plan and One Nebraska initiatives, with further direction anticipated once the new Policy Analyst is onboarded.

c. Continuum of Care

Tammy Sassaman provided an overview of the "Lifebook" draft developed by the workgroup. The Lifebook is designed as a dynamic, high-level snapshot tool focusing on three core areas:

- **Identity:** Family details, cultural practices, routines, food/language preferences.
- **Continuity:** Medications, immediate mental/behavioral health needs, appointments, and placement history.
- **Empowerment:** Personal preferences and self-advocacy notes to ease placement transitions and reduce re-traumatization.

The tool is intended to travel with youth across placements (such as detention to group homes/Boys Town) alongside standard formal documentation.

8. YRTC Update

Sarah Brownell presented the YRTC updates:

- a. **Whitehall Updates:** Whitehall no longer falls under the Office of Juvenile Services and is now overseen by the Division of Behavioral Health under Dr. Sean Curtis. Exterior safety repairs have begun. Senators toured the site on June 29, and an interim study hearing was held on June 30.
- b. **YRTC Findings:** Jennifer Carter shared that the OIG findings report has been finalized and submitted to the agency for its 15-day statutory review window. Once finalized next week, the report and executive summary will be made public and shared with the committee.
- c. **New Construction:** Construction on the new facility in Kearney is complete, with final safety and security measures being finalized. The new living unit at Hastings is progressing ahead of schedule, with expected completion in October 2026.
- d. **Staffing and Census:** Camella Jacobe is serving as Interim Youth Facility Senior Administrator. Census numbers as of July 22, 2026:
 - **Hastings:** 15
 - **Kearney:** 58
 - **Lincoln:** 15

Percentages of youth committed by county at the YRTCs were provided after the meeting:

9. Probation Update

Amoreena Brady provided updates and handouts regarding Juvenile Probation: [Juvenile Intake Infographic Q1 2026.pdf](#), [Q2-2026-Juvenile-Infographics.pdf](#)

- **Intake Data & LB 530:** Distributed the Q1 2026 intake data infographic generated following LB 530 changes.
- **Quarterly Metrics:** Total probation population decreased from 2,711 (Q2 2025) to 2,539 (Q2 2026). Successful probation completions increased to 80% (up from 78%), ensuring automatic record sealing for those youth. Time spent on probation for status youth decreased to 11 months. An upcoming August judicial webinar will address new status youth case management tools.
- **District 11 & 12 Scan Implementation:** Subcommittees are addressing prioritized recommendations from the UNK environmental scan, emphasizing expansion of in-home treatment services and **Thrive Mentoring**. Thrive is a judicial-led, informal natural-support mentoring model currently operating in parts of Districts 1, 8, 10, and 11, with plans to expand further into Districts 11 and 12.
- **SJI Grant Award:** Nebraska Probation was awarded a State Justice Institute (SJI) grant to conduct a Probation and Youth Justice System Review in District 4J (Douglas County) in partnership with the RFK National Resource Center, set to begin in September 2026.

10. New Business

- **RADIUS Milestone:** Nick Juliano shared that RADIUS celebrated its 3-year anniversary on July 11. Highlights include 10 high school graduates, dozens of successful probation discharges, and an initial internal recidivism rate of ~18% (compared to the statewide high-risk average of 27–33%). RADIUS is partnering with Dr. Keith Cruz on Risk-Needs-Responsivity (RNR) implementation.
- **NJJA Conference:** Tammy Sassaman announced that NJJA will host a one-day conference in Columbus, NE, on September 23, 2026. Save-the-date notices have been distributed.
- **Upstream Mapping Roundtable:** Deb VanDyke-Ries and Judge Denise Kracl shared that a local data discussion and Upstream Community Mapping event led by Judge Kracl and Judge Flaherty will take place on September 10–11 in Columbus.
